A NOTE FROM PASTOR EMILY:

Have mercy on me, 0 God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.
Psalm 51:1

We are nearly through another Lent. We have gathered on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings to hear scripture and sing beautiful liturgy. We have engaged in fasting practices and, in some cases, taken on new disciplines. We have prayed, made special offerings, and immersed ourselves in God's word, all to prepare our hearts and minds for the journey that Jesus makes to Golgotha. We began in ashes and we will end at the foot of the cross.

I've always found it a bit ironic that we spend this season readying ourselves for Jesus' death on the cross when the world outside is beginning to burst with new life. It's hard to think of ashes when the pollen is so thick that you can shovel it. But even amidst the profusion of blossoms, death intrudes. It is never really very far away from us. And perhaps that is the reason we go out of our way to avoid thinking about it. We refuse to discuss end-of-life care with our loved ones, we put off making a will, and we certainly don't want to think about funeral arrangements. It is the one thing in life we know for sure is coming, and yet, too often, we fail to plan for it.

Lent is the church's way of planning for it. We have the tremendous gift of knowing that the cross exists. We know for sure that Jesus will go to the cross and die for our transgressions. There is never any doubt about the way this story will turn out, regardless of how many times we tell it. And so we get ready for it: we listen, we reflect, and we repent.

We are able to do this because we know what comes next. We know that after the cross comes the tomb, and out of the tomb comes the resurrection and new life. We can make the journey of Lent because we are strengthened by the knowledge of Easter. After death comes new life, every time.

That story never changes. It was true for Jesus. It is true for the church. It is true for us. Our God is the God of the living, drawing us out of the depths, and into new life. May this Easter season fill you with the joy of the resurrection and the peace of new life.



From Linda Blazek:

March 17th was St. Patrick's day. He was a patron saint of Ireland and helped with the growth of Christianity throughout the Emerald Isle and of course that famous shamrock.

He explained the Christian idea of the divine Trinity by using something as simple as a shamrock — God's simultaneously three in one, as Creator, Christ, and Holy Spirit was sometimes a challenge for people to grasp and understand.

St. Patrick did it this way: he looked around, and then plucked a lowly shamrock from the ground at his feet. Three leaves, he said, and yet one stem, one life. Add to that the shamrock's vibrant shade of green, the color of growth and vitality — and while it's easy to imagine a more technical, lengthy explanation of the Trinity, it's hard to imagine a better one.




