A NOTE FROM PASTOR EMILY:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the

poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to

let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." -Luke 4:18-19

The Christmas rush is over. The cookies and sweets have been consumed, the wrapping paper tossed into the recycling bin, and the malls are busy with returns and exchanges. Decorations will start coming down in the next few days, and the post-holiday malaise will infect our communities. But not the church.

While none of us are completely inoculated against the inevitable let-down after a big celebration, our focus has begun to shift toward what it means that Christ has come into the world. Over the next few weeks we will hear the stories and accounts that begin to fill in a broader picture of who this Jesus character is and why we should care that once upon a time a star shone to herald his birth.

We will hear about his baptism, his first miracle, and his first foray into proclaiming God's kingdom. Our excitement over a tiny child, bedded down in a manger, will be transformed into the deeper joy of witnessing the full flowering of God's plan for the world.

Of course, we will struggle to understand. We will hear Jesus' words proclaiming the year of the Lord's favor, and we will wonder if that proclamation applies to this year, too. After all, this all happened so long ago. The world is a much different place now. It is a scary, fractured, and hurting place. The world seems focused on terror, instead of peace, persecution instead of tolerance, and captivity instead of freedom. Could the Lord really favor this coming year?

These words of Jesus, quoted from Isaiah, are perhaps more relevant than ever. If we were not hurting, if we were not fractured, if we were not broken and lost in sin, then perhaps there would be no need for that Bethlehem birth. But we are, and God knows it. We, too, need to hear Jesus' words and promises and know that they are for us, today.


Composer Spotlight

Starting this 2022, I would love to provide a "spotlight" on at least one composer whose music will be heard during a worship service during the month. This January at the service of the Epiphany / Baptism of Christ, the choir at Incarnation Lutheran will perform a fitting anthem entitled "The Baptism of Christ" by a composer who was born right here in the Carolinas, Austin Lovelace. The following information is taken from one of his publishers, ECS.

Austin C. Lovelace (1919-2010) was born in Rutherford County, North Carolina in 1919. He received his A.B. from High Point College in 1939 and his M.S.M. and D.S.M. from the School of Sacred Music at Union Theological Seminary in New York City in 1941 and 1950, respectively. He was Past President and a Fellow of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada.

Dr. Lovelace was Minister of Music Emeritus at Wellshire Presbyterian Church in Denver, Colorado. He worked at a number of Presbyterian and Methodist churches in Colorado, Illinois, Nebraska and North Carolina, and at three seminaries: Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois, Union Theological Seminary in New York City, and Iliff School of Theology in Denver. Dr. Lovelace also worked as a consultant and lecturer, and appeared as a Director of Music for general conferences.

In 1954, he served as the organist for the Assembly of the World Council of Churches. More than eight hundred of his compositions for church have been published. Dr. Lovelace was also well known as a writer, having produced books and many articles on church hymnody.
