A NOTE FROM PASTOR EMILY:

Part of our Lenten practice each year is to encourage one another to engage with the Word of God. We do this through prayer, study, service, and a variety of other disciplines. Regarding this practice, Bonhoeffer wrote, "Why do I meditate? Because I am a Christian. Therefore, every day in which I do not penetrate more deeply into the knowledge of God's Word in Holy Scripture is a lost day for me. I can only move forward with certainty upon the firm ground of the Word of God. And, as a Christian, I learn to know the Holy Scripture in no other way than by hearing the Word preached and by prayerful meditation."

This Lent, I encourage you to take up the practice of meditation on the word of God each day. Whether that is through a daily devotion, time set aside each day for prayer, journaling about your experience of God that day, or some other discipline, allow God's word to speak into your life.

I also encourage you to take part in the variety of worship experiences here at Incarnation. For example, our Wednesday night worship and supper is a wonderful way to engage your faith midweek. This year, we will also offer a progressive "Stations of the Cross" each Wednesday and Sunday. I encourage you to come early to the service, or to stay late, and to meditate on Christ's journey from the table of the Last Supper to the empty tomb on Easter morning. These are designed to be "handson" experiences, and will include child-appropriate activities. I have included the first station below for you to try at home.

Stations of the Cross

Station 1: The Last Supper

While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

-Matthew 26:26-29

Find some bread in your kitchen and place a piece on a napkin or plate. It is a simple food that finds a home in every culture in some form or fashion. For Christians, bread is inextricably tied to the sacrament of Holy Communion, when we share in the body and blood of Christ and remember that we are one. It is a time of fellowship, blessing, and grace, as we acknowledge our connection to God and to one another. The Last Supper was one of Jesus' last moments with his disciples. Their friendship and care for one another must have brought a measure of comfort to him as he contemplated what was coming. Break off a bit of bread and eat it while thinking about how Jesus must have been feeling at this meal. What strength do we take from being part of a community? What do we contribute?

Little Free Pantry:

As I check Our Little Free Pantry during the week, it appears that the food we provide is assisting those in the community. We will continue to need donations of food throughout the year. I have placed a large gray storage bin in the hallway as you come in the side door near the office. It includes a sign that says LITTLE FREE PANTRY.

Please place any items you wish to donate in the bin. If you are unable to donate foods during church office hours or on Sunday, please feel free to place them directly into the Little Free Pantry.

I will check the Pantry and the bin 1-2 times per week. At that time I will reorganize all food and restock as needed. I will periodically let you know when we need additional food items.

Items currently needed: Peanut Butter, crackers, tuna fish, individual servings of fruit, small boxes of cereal, ramen noodles, soup, individual servings of macaroni and cheese, and pasta meals.

Please make sure foods are non-perishable and are within the expiration date.

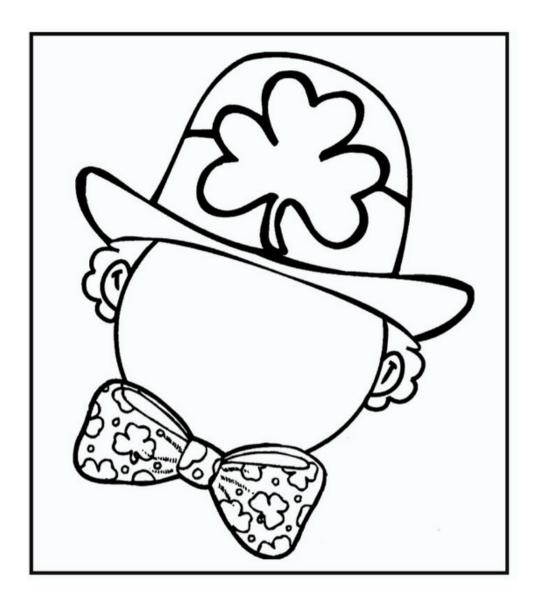
