A NOTE FROM PASTOR EMILY:

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances; for this

is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

- 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

This is one of my favorite verses. I find it impossible to live up to of course, which is, perhaps, why it is one of my favorites. It's a reminder to me that our intentions do not always coincide with our actions, and that somehow God continues to love us anyway.

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances. It is a tall order. Especially in light of all that the past couple of years have held.

But even when we can't live up to this scriptural command, we are expected to live into it. That means that we look for ways to rejoice even in the face of grief and trials. It means remembering to lift up every bit of our lives to God in prayer: our joys, our concerns, ourselves, our neighbors, and yes, even those who hate us. Living into this vision for God's people means being thankful for the abundant blessings that God has poured out upon us, and then treating those blessings as precious, valuable aspects of our lives together, and working to protect them.

These verses, I think, are less about being the perfect community and more about how we participate in the imperfect communities of which we are actually a part. Change and renewal starts with one person at a time, after all. These words call us to do better by one another, to evaluate our lives together and our responsibilities to one another in light of God's great love for us, and then to live accordingly, even if imperfectly. That effort begins and is shaped by this call from God to rejoice, pray, and give thanks.

Later this month, our nation will gather around tables and break bread together. We will say prayers of thanksgiving for family, friends, and for God's provision. We will rejoice over being with one another, perhaps after a long time apart. And because we are only human, we will probably have an argument or two with someone we truly care about. What a blessing to know that God understands that, too.

May God bless our time together, and may we continue to live into the kind of community where we rejoice with one another, give thanks for one another, and lift all things to God in prayer.

Another exciting anniversary is this year as well. Did you know our Child Care Ministry is celebrating its 40th year? Indeed! The ministry started in 1981 as a part time mothers morning out program. It was designed as a deliberate outreach on the part of the church and was spearheaded by then Pastor David Donges. The ministry's statement of mission and purpose continues to guide us:

It shall be the mission of the Child Care Ministry to provide programs that are deemed to be of the greatest need in the community within the facilities and resources of the church. The purpose of our Centers is to provide a Christian atmosphere for children to develop their fullest potential in a positive environment. The staff shall encourage the children to be independent, to assume responsibility, to learn to cooperate with others, and to express his/her own ideas.

The congregation stepped out in faith and conviction to open an additional Child Care Ministry location in September 2007. This satellite location is at 400 Byron Road and near the Veteran's Hospital. This location serves children, infants through 3 years old.

We are blessed and thankful to celebrate this milestone in conjunction with the 100th anniversary of the congregation! We are looking forward to the future with hope and promise. Thanks be to God!

Incarnation wrote to Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia, in December 1961 to inquire about obtaining Chrismons for Incarnation. Ascension Lutheran Church was the originator of Chrismons in 1957, just four years before, so Incarnation was one of the "early adopters" of this ministry!
