This was brought home to me recently when I was talking to a youth that I had baptized as a toddler not too long ago, and they shared that they've recently begun the college shopping process. I was not emotionally prepared for that statement. But life rolls on, and we do our best to keep up. In the life of the church, we are preparing our hearts and minds for the season of Lent. It seems as though we just packed away our Christmas decorations, but Ash Wednesday is right around the corner.

This year, we will again be offering Wednesday Evening Worship as a time to refocus our attention on the approaching cross. We will begin with a light supper of soup and bread (beginning at 5:45), followed by a short service beginning at 6:30. This year, we will be looking at the parable of the Good Samaritan as a vehicle for considering our call to care for one another. In an election year, it is more important than ever that we continue to listen to and seek to understand our neighbor.

Whether it is through our Lent services or not, I encourage you to make time in your schedule to reflect on meaning of Lent as we prepare our hearts and minds for Christ's journey to the cross. Perhaps take up a Lenten discipline such as daily prayer or study, or commit to a fast of some type, such as giving up a food or something like social media. Sacrificial giving is also a discipline of Lent, one that encourages us to see all things as God's. Whatever you take on this season, I pray that you have a meaningful journey as we turn our attention to the cross.


MUSIC CORNER

STEWARDSHIP

Stewarding your best year ever!



Jesus taught, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven." –Matthew 5:43-44

Red hearts, flowers and chocolates remind us that February is the uncontested month of love. It's excellent (and easy) to love those close to us, but Jesus tells us to go wider, deeper, riskier – to love even our enemies. In so doing, Jesus says, we become children of God.

This challenges us to embrace love as the key discipline and develop a heart so full of love that it flows to even our enemies. Isn't that how we're supposed to live as disciples? It's just good stewardship of our lives.

For this "month of love," practice loving your enemies.

The effort is especially timely in our season of discord, when our loudest voices encourage us – through name-calling, denigrating, lying, smearing – to hate those with whom we disagree. Even calling them "enemies" is too much (they're really neighbors!).

Loving our "enemies" doesn't mean we agree with them or tolerate bad behavior. It means respecting, listening, discussing, refraining from anger and revenge. Jesus gives us the first step: Pray! For them and for you!

By embracing love as a spiritual discipline, we cultivate a heart of love that opens our lives to the transformation Jesus dearly desires for us -- to be children of God. Now that's good stewardship.
