

A NOTE FROM PASTOR EMILY:

I Love to Tell the STORY

South Carolina Synod Assembly 2022

For three days in June, representatives from across South Carolina gathered in Charleston to attend this year's Synod Assembly. This was the first in-person gathering we've held since the pandemic and it was so good to see friends and colleagues from across the state. Incarnation was represented by Linda Blazek, Mary Kehl, Rowan Willhide, Kimi Dail, and myself. It was a wonderful event and I thought I'd share a little bit about what we learned this year, as well as some of the stories we heard about our church and the remarkable things that God is doing through it.

The theme this year was "I Love to Tell the Story". Deacon Mitzie Schafer was our keynote speaker and encouraged us to think about the ways in which we tell the story of the church. Are we simply conveying information? Or are we inviting others in by telling them why it matters, who will be impacted, and where we believe God is moving us to be?

Throughout the Assembly, we heard incredible stories from around the church that modeled effective storytelling while revealing the abundant grace of God. From Pastor Chris Christopher we heard the story of Restoration Chapel, a program dedicated to helping those struggling with addiction. From Sydnie Taylor, the president of Lutheran Church Youth (LCY), we heard a story of radical welcome and how it has changed and influenced her life. From Pastor Susan Crowell we heard the story of Trinity Lutheran's journey to becoming a Reconciling in Christ Congregation, and how that transformation embodied the gospel in their community. We heard from Lutheran Men in Mission, WELCA, Christ Mission, and Lutheran Services, and it was evident in each story that the Spirit has been active throughout the church in beautiful and varied ways. We were also blessed with an "official storyteller" this year. Pastor Mary Canniff-Kuhn joined us throughout Assembly to tell us children's stories that opened up scripture for us. The room, usually filled with the sounds of shuffling paper and whispers, fell silent when Pastor Mary began to speak. We hung on her every word, and by the end of the story, most of us had goosebumps.

What kind of story are we telling about Incarnation Lutheran Church? What kind of story are we telling about our faith? What kind of story are we telling about Jesus? That's what I've been thinking about since I came home from Assembly. I think we have a wonderful collection of stories here in our church home of Incarnation Lutheran Church. How are we sharing them?

The week concluded at beautiful Auer Recital Hall and I had the pleasure of performing one work by Brahms as well as accompanied the festival choir in an anthem by William Mathias. One of the highlights of the week for me was a visit to the Lilly Library to see first edition printings of the King James Bible, the Guttenberg Bible, and early publications by Martin Luther. 


STEWARDSHIP

Be Stewards of our Elders' Wisdom



"Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you." -Exodus 20:12

This month as our culture celebrates the fourth of July, which was secured by our distant elders. God's people can make the occasions much more substantive than just parties, and picnics.

Instead, we can lift up the knowledge, wisdom and perspective that we possess from not only the mother and father figures in our own circles, but all the older men and women who have enriched our communities with their lives and experiences.

The wisdom of the past has helped people of every age to navigate the challenges of their times. Many communities in the world honor, respect, and value as "elders" their oldest members. It's something we surely can use in 21st century North America. Ours is a time of unprecedented change – both in the sweep of change and in the speed at which things are changing. Our older members can give us perspective and patience and wisdom. Here are some ideas:

- Engage elders about issues facing you, your congregation and community. Listen deeply. Take notes, after all, they have been there and got through it.
- Enter into their thought world: How do they frame issues? What are their underlying assumptions? What sources help inform and inspire them? You may be surprised by their wisdom.
- Compare their approaches to seeing the world and navigating challenges with your own. What is helpful? What can assist you?

Learning from our elder mother, father and member figures may be the best way to not only honor them, but also help us find our own way in life.

LITTLE FREE PANTRY

The Little Food Pantry is providing for those in our community who experience homelessness and/or lack of funds for food. I personally have been told by individuals who have used our pantry how grateful they are for the assistance we give.

We need the following items:

1. Pop Top containers of individual servings of Ravioli, Mac and Cheese, Spaghetti/Any pasta in sauce, Chili, Tuna
2. Canned Protein/Meats - Chicken, Ham, Tuna, Salmon, Sausage
3. Canned fruit - pop top and individual plastic cups
4. Carbohydrates such as Cereal (small servings are best,) Granola Bars, Pasta, Rice, Oatmeal, Grits, Crackers
5. Peanut Butter
6. Feminine Paper Products (Tampons and Pads)
7. Toiletries - hotel size soap, lotion, shampoo
