But every now and again, something spectacular will catch our eye. Every now and again, we see God so clearly that we wonder how we've missed seeing God's presence all the other hours of the day. And for just that moment, we have an inkling of the stunning nature of God and existence. It is in those moments that we experience the deep and abiding thankfulness that is a hallmark of the Christian faith. In those timeless moments when God is revealed to us, we are suddenly made aware of all that God has done for us, and all that God has made in this world that is good.



30 Days of Thanksgiving



I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. -John 10:10b

Thankful people are happy people. It's not just a feel-good slogan on a refrigerator magnet or bumper sticker; it's proven science. "Gratitude helps people feel more positive emotions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships," reports Harvard Medical School's *Healthbeat*. That sounds like the abundant life Jesus describes in the gospels, doesn't it?

So why aren't Christians more thankful and happy? While we all sometimes face hardships that can avert our thankfulness, many of us simply take our blessings for granted. Perhaps we have succumbed to the lie we hear from 24/7 advertising – that we never *have* enough and never *are* enough.

Hopeful news from researchers is that thankfulness can be cultivated. Those who consistently *practice thankfulness* develop gratitude and happiness. This November, the month of Thanksgiving, make thankfulness a daily spiritual practice.

Here are some ideas for "30 Days of Thanksgiving":

- **Pray thanksgiving.** In your morning and evening prayers, thank God for your life and whatever specific blessings come to mind.
- **Keep a thanks diary.** Every day write down what you are thankful for and why. Challenge yourself to find and pray about 10 things daily.
- Say thank you. Go out of your way to express thanks to the people you encounter every day.

Practice thankfulness consistently and you might be surprised to find yourself enjoying the abundant life Jesus promises us.

TROOP 8 NEWS

Great news from Pack and Troop 8!

Over 75 elementary kids and parents attended the district-wide recruitment event at Incarnation on September 12. Scouts demonstrated Pinewood Derby cars and knot-tying, among other skills, and served over 100 hot dogs. Nine new Cub Scouts have joined since, making the Pack's official enrollment 32, with 10 adult volunteers. Another 15 families are considering joining!

Troop 8 is rolling along with 26 Scouts. We graduated four Eagle Scouts last year, and one scout has completed his project and is working towards Eagle this year. The Troop sold over \$11,000 worth of popcorn as a fundraiser– thanks to all the Incarnation folks who purchased. Scouts are integral to Oktoberfest. They came out in force to unload the truck, set up, serve during the festival, and tear down the CDC parking lot.

The leadership has planned biking, wilderness survival, shotgun shooting, skiing, and more for this year. Troop 8 met with Mayor Daniel Rickenmann in the summer of 2022 and heard about local government. Sheriff Leon Lott also paid them a visit and talked about law enforcement and leadership. The boys asked a lot of really good questions!

During the past summer, the Troop was pleased to host representatives from Riverbanks Zoo and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources, both of whom described their responsibilities and their career paths. Ten Scouts attended Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico and enjoyed some crazy outdoor time. Another contingent went to Camp Barstow for a week and earned multiple merit badges.

As always, the Pack, Troop and their respective leaders appreciate Incarnation Lutheran's sponsorship and support. Scouting is on the upswing in the Midlands, and both Pack 8 and Troop 8 are leading the way in participation gains in the last couple of years.
